## Saints of the Week

#### Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary -

The Solemnity of the Assumption is, in some ways, the paramount feast of Our Lady, since it commemorates her passing, body and soul, into glory in Heaven, where she stands beside her Son 'in garments of gold'. Though the dogma of the Assumption was only defined in 1950, it was widely believed by the earliest Christians. The Blessed Virgin truly leads the way; she

fulfilled her vocation in humility and, given her Immaculate Conception, the grave was no place for her body. Where she is now, we one day hope to be.

## Memorial of St Stephen of Hungary, King – 16<sup>th</sup> August

St Stephen (Istvan) (c.975-1038) was baptised at the age of ten, when his father, the Duke of Hungary, converted to Christianity. He married Gisela, sister of the Holy Roman Emperor St Henry, and succeeded his father in 997. Crowned first King of Hungary in 1001, he ruled forcefully and with great wisdom and did much to encourage the evangelisation of his people. His wife was beatified in 1975; his son Emeric (Imre), who predeceased him, is also venerated as a saint.

## Memorial of St John Eudes, Priest – 19<sup>th</sup> August

St Joh Eudes (1601-1680) was born in the Norman village of Ri (France), joined the Oratory in Paris and was ordained in 1625. He went on to found the Congregation of Jesus and Mary (Eudists) and the Sisters of Our Lady of Charity of the Refuge. A popular preacher, he promoted devotion to the Hearts of Jesus and Mary. He was canonised in 1925.

## Memorial of St Bernard, Abbot, Doctor - 20<sup>th</sup> August

St Bernard (c.1090-1153) was born into a noble family at Fontaines, near Dijon (France). In 1113 he joined the new monastery at Cîteaux and went on to found the Cistercian house at Clairvaux. St Bernard became known as a talented theologian, preacher and controversialist, enjoying a correspondence with monarchs and popes. He managed to combine a life of action with one of mystical contemplation, as revealed in his writings. Declared a Doctor of the Church in 1830, he is known as 'the last of the Fathers'.



#### Pope applauds Ukrainian grain deal as sign of hope for peace

"I would like to welcome the departure from Ukraine's ports of the first ships loaded with grain." Pope Francis made that remark on Sunday while speaking at the noon-day Angelus prayer.

Four bulk carrier ships set sail from Ukrainian Black Sea ports on Sunday, after the first ships left the port city of Odessa



early last week following Russia's invasion of Ukraine on 24 February. The Pope said the deal charts the path forward toward peace.

"This step shows that it is possible to dialogue and achieve concrete results, which benefit everyone. Therefore, this event can be seen as a sign of hope, and I sincerely hope that, following this path, we can put an end to the fighting and arrive at a just and lasting peace." **End of blockade:** Turkey and the United Nations brokered a deal in July between Russia and Ukraine to allow the export of Ukrainian foodstuffs through the Black Sea.

The deal ended a months-long blockade of Ukrainian ports, which had led to soaring grain prices around the globe. The UN had warned of possible outbreaks of famine in various places due to the lack of Ukrainian grain shipments. Before the war, Ukraine and Russia together made up nearly a third of global wheat exports.

**Joint oversight efforts:** A Joint Coordination Centre (JCC) has been set up in Istanbul to oversee the shipping of Ukrainian grain, and is staffed by Russian, Ukrainian, Turkish, and UN

personnel. The four bulk carriers which left port on Sunday were carrying nearly 170,000 tons of corn and other foodstuffs, according to Ukraine's sea ports authority.

Saturday marked the first time a foreign-flagged ship arrived in Ukraine to be loaded with grain since the outbreak of the war in February. Ukraine's Infrastructure Minister said Sunday that the country hopes to soon be able to ship around 3 million tons of good each month.

"We are gradually moving on to larger volumes of work," said Oleksandr Kubrakov on Facebook. "We plan to ensure the ability of the ports to handle at least 100 vessels per month in the near future."

## Pope prays for victims of bus crash in Croatia

Praying that Our Lady intercede for the victims and their families, Pope Francis remembered the Polish pilgrims who perished in a bus crash in Croatia on Saturday morning.

The bus was taking them on pilgrimage to Medjugorje, Bosnia-Herzegovina. At least 12 people were killed, and another 32 were injured. Speaking after the recitation of the Sunday Angelus, the Pope expressed his condolences over the incident, offering prayers for all those who died, the injured and their families.



"I learned with sorrow the news of the bus crash yesterday morning in Croatia. Several Polish pilgrims on their way to Medjugorje lost their lives and others were injured. May Our Lady intercede for them and their families."

**Catholic pilgrims**: On Saturday, Croatia's prime minister expressed his sorrow for the deaths of the Polish pilgrims who died after their bus veered off the A4 road between the Croatian villages of Jarek Bisaski and Podvorec, northeast of Zagreb, the capital. The bus ended up in a roadside ditch. Croatian officials said the passengers, including three priests and six nuns, were headed to Medjugorje, which draws hundreds of thousands of visitors yearly.

Poland's justice minister and prosecutor general have ordered the Warsaw Prosecutors Office to investigate the cause of the crash
