
News from our Diocese

Saints of the Week


Memorial of St John Chrysostom, Bishop and Doctor - 13th September

St John Chrysostom (c350-407) was born at Antioch and trained as a lawyer. He became a monk, then later a priest and became a famed theologian and preacher, gaining the name Chrysostom or 'the golden-mouthed'. In 398 he became Archbishop of Constantinople and faced much opposition in his reforms. He died in exile and is honoured as one of the four Greek Doctors of the Church. The Divine Liturgy of St John Chrysostom, widely used in the East, was once attributed to him, although it is now recognised as very probably later than his time.



Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross - 14th September

The Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross commemorates the rescue of the relic of the True Cross by Emperor Heraclius in 629 after it had been captured by the Persians; it also marks the original dedication of the Church of the Holy Sepulchre, where relics of the Cross were kept, in 335. The Feast celebrates the Cross, the instrument of our salvation, and is in many ways an extension of Good Friday. The Cross is a great and powerful sign of God's love for us - a love stronger than death - and also a daily reality in our lives: the only true path to holiness.



Memorial of Our Lady of Sorrows - 15th September

This feast originated as a memorial of the Seven Sorrows of Mary, most of which were linked to the events of Good Friday, when she stood at the foot of the cross. We remember that the Blessed Virgin had to live through the personal tragedy of seeing her Son die. She had a unique share in our redemption, offering her Son's life to the Lord, trusting that it was part of his plan.



Memorial of Ss Cornelius, Pope, and Cyprian, Bishop, Martyrs - 16th September

St Cornelius (+253) was elected Pope in succession to St Fabian and actively fought the errors of Novatian, which denied that those who had lapsed from the faith could be reconciled. He died while exiled in Civitavecchia (Italy) and is venerated as a martyr.



St Cyprian (+258) was another leading opponent of Novatianism. He was Bishop of Carthage and one of the earliest victims of the persecution under the Emperor Valerian. Both saints are included in the Roman Canon.

Memorial of St Robert Bellarmine, Doctor - 17th September

St Robert Bellarmine (1542-1621) was born at Montepulciano (Italy) and joined the Society of Jesus. He was later created a Cardinal and was briefly Archbishop of Capua, although his greatest legacy is as a theologian and controversialist, especially in defending the Church from its Protestant critics. He was canonised only in 1930, and declared a Doctor of the Church the following year.

Vatican News

Pope Francis on Saturday morning received in audience Christopher John Trott, Great Britain's new Ambassador to the Holy See.

A statement released by the British Embassy to the Holy See stated that following the audience,

Ambassador Trott said: "I was honoured to present my Credentials to His Holiness Pope Francis this morning. Today marks a highlight of my diplomatic career and I look forward to building further on the excellent relations between the United Kingdom and the Holy See during my ambassadorial mandate".

The Ambassador went on to note that "Throughout his Pontificate, Pope Francis has been working tirelessly on the global issues of our time," and said it will be a great privilege for him to "work together with the Holy See and the Catholic networks to make a difference to the issues which concern us, from poverty to climate change, conflict prevention, international development, and freedom of religion and belief."

Pope calls for welcome and protection for Afghan refugees

Pope Francis on Sunday asked States across the globe to welcome and protect vulnerable Afghans who are fleeing their country.

"In these troubled times that see Afghans seeking refuge," he said during the Angelus, "I pray for the most vulnerable among them. I pray that many countries will welcome and protect those seeking a new life."

Pope Francis said he is also praying for internally displaced persons in the country "that they may have assistance and the necessary protection."

Human dignity, peace, fraternity

"May young Afghans receive education, an essential good for human development, and may all Afghans, whether at home, in transit, or in host countries, live with dignity, in peace and fraternity with their neighbours," he said.
