

Saints of the Week

Memorial of St Ignatius of Antioch, Bishop, Martyr - 17th October

St Ignatius (+c.107) followed St Peter as bishop of Antioch and was thrown to wild beasts in Rome (possibly at the Colosseum) during the persecution of Trajan. On his way to Rome he wrote seven epistles, which give a clear picture of Christian belief and practice a century or so after Christ's birth. His name is mentioned in the Roman Canon.




Feast of St Luke, Evangelist - 18th October

St Luke (first century) was a Greek, possibly from Antioch, who trained as a doctor. He converted to Christianity, became a disciple of St Paul and wrote both a Gospel and the Acts of the Apostles. His vivid descriptions of the childhood of Jesus has led some to believe that he was close to the Blessed Virgin Mary. He is believed to have died in his old age, and may have been martyred; he is patron of doctors and artists.



Solemnity of St Philip Howard, Martyr, Patron of the Diocese - 19th October

Saint Philip Howard, 20th Earl of Arundel (28 June 1557- 19 October 1595) was an English <u>nobleman</u> and Co-Principal Patron of the Diocese. He was <u>canonised</u> by <u>Pope Paul VI</u> in 1970, as one of the Forty Martyrs of England and Wales. The blood of the martyrs is the seed of the Church, as Tertullian famously stated in the 2nd century. St Philip Howard, with so many of the martyrs of the Reformation, chose the suffering of the cross over worldly acclaim. Why? Because Christ was his first love. May he be yours and mine too.



Memorial of St John Paul II, Pope - 22nd October

Karol Jozef Wojtyla was born in 1920 in Wadowice, Poland. After his ordination to the priesthood and theological studies in Rome, he returned to his homeland and resumed various

pastoral and academic tasks. He became first auxiliary bishop and, in 1964, Archbishop of Krakow and took part in the Second Vatican Council. On 16 October 1978 he was elected pope and took the name John Paul II. His exceptional apostolic zeal, particularly for families, young people and the sick, led him to numerous pastoral visits throughout the world. Among the many fruits which he has left as a heritage to the Church are above all his rich Magisterium and the promulgation of the Catechism of the Catholic



Church as well as the Code of Canon Law for the Latin Church and for the Eastern Churches. In Rome on April 2, 2005, the eve of the Second Sunday of Easter (or of Divine Mercy), he departed peacefully in the Lord.

Vatican News

Pope to Scalabrinian missionaries: To be inclusive we must be creative

Addressing a group of Scalabrinian missionaries, who are in Rome for the Canonisation of St. John Baptist Scalabrini, Pope Francis commented on the diversity of their assembly, noting that in this way, "you well represent the breadth of Bishop Scalabrini's work, the openness of his heart, to which, so to speak, one diocese was not enough."



During the audience on Monday, the Pope then

spoke of Bishop Scalabrini's work, saying his apostolate in favour of Italian emigrants was "of great importance".

During his ministry in the late 1800s, explained the Pope, thousands of Italians were leaving for the Americas. "Bishop Scalabrini looked at them with the gaze of Christ...and he took care with great charity and pastoral intelligence to provide them with adequate material and spiritual assistance."

Migration today, like migration yesterday: Turning to the realities surrounding migration nowadays, Pope Francis noted that "migrations constitute a very important challenge", just as they did in St. Scalabrini's day. He explained that "they highlight the urgent need to put fraternity before rejection, solidarity before indifference."

"Every baptised person is called to reflect God's gaze towards His migrant and refugee brothers and sisters; to let His gaze widen our gaze, thanks to the encounter with humanity on the move, through a concrete proximity, following the example of Bishop Scalabrini."

Continuing to stress the importance of encounter and humanity when speaking of the plight of migrants, Pope Francis reminded those present that "we are called today to live and spread the culture of encounter, an encounter on an equal footing between migrants and the people of the host country." This experience, he continued, is both enriching and fruitful, because it reveals the beauty of diversity and reminds us that "the faith, hope and tenacity of migrants can be an example and a spur for those who want to commit themselves to building a world of peace and well-being for all." In order for the world to be better for everyone, added the Pope, "we must start from the last."

Think outside the box: Pope Francis went on to remind those present that we are called to think creatively and "outside-the-box" in order to make fraternity and social friendship grow. "We are called to open new spaces, where art, music and being together become instruments of intercultural dynamics, where we can savour the richness of the encounter of diversity." Bringing his discourse to an end, Pope Francis noted that it is precisely for this reason that he urges each Scalabrinian missionary to "always let yourselves be inspired by your Holy Founder, father of migrants, of all migrants."

"May his charism renew in you the joy of being with migrants, of being at their service, and of doing it with faith, animated by the Holy Spirit, in the conviction that in each of them we meet the Lord Jesus," he concluded.

"May the holiness of John Baptist Scalabrini 'infect' us with the desire to be saints, each one in an original, unique way, as God's infinite imagination has made us and wants us to be."
