Saints of the Fortnight

St Thomas Aguinas, Priest & Doctor of the Church – 28th January

St Thomas Aquinas (c1224-1274) was a Dominican friar who became one of the most important Christian philosophers and theologians. Known as the 'Angelic Doctor', he had an astonishing mastery of scholastic theology and a profound holiness of lie. His greatest work the Summa Theologica, is



still widely used. Pope Leo XIII declared him patron of Catholic Schools.



St John Bosco, Priest – 31st January

St John Bosco (1815-1888) was born in Piedmont (Italy) and devoted his life to Catholic education. This 'Apostle of Youth' founded the Salesian Order, named in honour of St Francis de Sales, and, with the help of St Mary Mazzarello, the Daughters of

Mary Help of Christians. Despite meeting much opposition, his aim was, above all, to educate through love.

St Cuthman of Steyning, Hermit (Diocesan Saint) – 8th February Lord God, you kept St Cuthman faithful to Christ's pattern of poverty and humility.
