MASS PROCEDURES FOR THE WEEKEND 18th/19th JULY

These are unusual times and with your safety in mind, the following protocols apply when attending Mass in Battle this weekend.

- Arrive at least 10 minutes before the start of Mass.
- Enter the Church via the sacristy. A steward will check your face covering and hand you on to a second steward who will show you to your place. Please sit facing the 'TICK' on the bench in front of you. Each bench will have spaces marked for 2 people, 1 metre apart or where a related couple occupy the inner seat, they will be distanced 1 metre from the single other occupant of the bench. Please do not move from your assigned seat.
- Holy Communion will be a host placed in the hand (not on the tongue). A steward will tell
  you when to approach the altar. You will see a small table at the head of the aisle. Stand
  close to this table and the priest will give you a Communion Host. The steward will show
  you back to your seat. If you are sitting on the aisle side of the bench, allow the wall side
  parishioners to enter the bench first: do not change places.
- When Mass is over a steward will come to your bench and ask you to leave. Please do so as
  quickly as possible as the Church has to be sanitised after Mass before the next Mass or
  prayer session.
- If you are reading, wear gloves and a face covering. Please follow the steward's guidance
  and sit on the right-hand side of the sanctuary ensuring you are 1 metre from the other
  reader. You may drop your mask when reading if you wish, remembering to replace it! The
  second reader will not be joined by the first for the Responsorial Psalm. Please remain
  until after the priest has left the altar and then exit via the Sacristy.
- Collection plates will be available as you leave the Church.

## Booking for Mass in future weeks

If you wish to attend Mass in either of our Churches for the foreseeable future, you must first register by e-mail <a href="mailto:battle@abdiocese.org.uk">battle@abdiocese.org.uk</a> or phone 01424 773125 by 9am on the Thursday of the week prior. It is very helpful if you do this earlier in the week if you can, rather than leaving it to the last minute.

Home Visits. At present home visits by Ministers have been suspended. Parishioners will be informed as soon as they are able to visit.

Church in Battle Open for Private Prayer. The church is our spiritual home, and parishioners are encouraged to attend if they can on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays from 10am - 11am.
