Pope expresses closeness to suffering Palestinians and Israelis

Addressing the crowds in Saint Peter's Square following the Sunday Angelus, Pope Francis addressed the very serious situation in Israel and Palestine, underscoring his closeness to all those suffering, Palestinians and Israelis. He said he remembers and prays for them every day, and he offers them his "embrace" at "this dark moment."

"May the weapons be stopped: they will never

lead to peace, and may the conflict not widen! Enough! Enough, brothers! In Gaza, let the wounded be rescued immediately, let civilians be protected, let far more humanitarian aid be allowed to reach that stricken population. May the hostages be freed, including the elderly and children. Every human being, Christian, Jewish, Muslim, of any people or religion, every human being is sacred, is precious in the eyes of God and has the right to live in peace. Let us not lose hope: let us pray and work tirelessly so that the sense of humanity may prevail over hardness of heart."

Pope urges prayers for peace wherever wars rage

As has now become customary at the end of his weekly General Audience, Pope Francis turned his thoughts to the many nations suffering the horrors of war. He asked for prayers for peace "every day" and "wherever there is war".

Martyred Ukraine: In particular, on Wednesday, the Holy Father asked for prayers "for martyred Ukraine, which suffers so much". Since Russia's

invasion of Ukraine in February 2022, over 9,600 civilians have been killed and over 17,500 injured.

Peace in the Holy Land: Pope Francis also asked for prayers for the Holy Land, "in Palestine and Israel". On 7 October, over 1,400 Israelis were killed in attacks perpetrated by Hamas. Since then, in retaliation airstrikes on the Gaza Strip, over 11,000 people have been killed and some 2,500 are missing under the rubble, according to the Hamas-run health ministry in Gaza. **Never forget Sudan:** Finally, the Holy Father turned his thoughts to Sudan, where an estimated 9,000 people have been killed and another 5.6 million have been forced to flee their homes due to a devastating war between two rival military factions that erupted in April. That civil war has been described as a "humanitarian catastrophe," with visible signs of ethnic cleansing, according

to the UK's Minister for Africa. "Let us think about wherever there is war," concluded the Pope, reminding all the faithful that sadly, "there are so many wars!" "Let us pray for peace: Every day, take some time to pray for peace. We desire peace," said the Pope.
