Introduction to the Scripture Readings for The Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time:

• First Reading: Leviticus 19:1-2. 17-18

The book of Leviticus can seem rather dry. It begins with the command to be as holy as God. This is an impossible command, but the point is to allow God to live that holiness within us by making space for God in our lives.

• Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 3:16-23

Paul writes to the Corinthians, a community made up of common people with no pretensions to greatness. He reminds them that their dignity comes from being temples of God.

Gospel: Matthew 5:38-48

Jesus sets out the implications of living as his disciples. He reminds us that God gives the same grace to good and bas people alike. The choice is ours, on a daily basis, whether to respond to it or not.



Pope Francis wraps up Apostolic Journey to South Sudan & DRC

"You are in my heart, you are in our hearts, you are in the hearts of Christians around the world! Never lose hope. And lose no opportunity to build peace."

Those words of encouragement were the final public comments which Pope Francis spoke on South Sudanese soil at the end of his 40th Apostolic Journey abroad. The papal plane departed from Juba's International Airport at 11:56 AM local time, carrying the Pope and over 70 journalists for the return trip to Rome. The Pope is scheduled to arrive in Rome at around 5:15 PM local time.

Overarching call to peace: Over the past six days,



Turning message into action: Huge crowds turned out for his public Masses: over a million people celebrated with him in DR Congo's capital, Kinshasa, and some 100,000 faithful gathered with him in Juba, around a fifth of the population of South Sudan's capital. As the papal plane took off from Juba, Archbishop Stephen Ameyu Martin Mulla of Juba told SSBC, the national public service broadcaster, that Pope Francis has left a message of hope and a call for the people of South Sudan to remain together and strive toward peace. "It is only by caring about our brothers and sisters that we can really realize this peace," he said. "We hope that our political leaders will listen to the message of the Holy Father properly, and the message of His Grace Archbishop Justin Welby and Rev. Iain Greenshields."
