
#### **Remembrance Sunday**


On November 11<sup>th</sup>, we pause in silence to remember those who died in war, and to pray for the victims of aggressions and inhumanity throughout the world. This is a day to pray for peace, to consider what we are doing as individuals, as a community, and as a nation to bring God's peace into the world. This is a day when a believing community may rededicate itself by prayer and action to the ideals Jesus gives us in the beatitudes.

#### Saints of the Week St Martin of Tours, Bishop - 11<sup>th</sup> November

St Martin (316-397) was born to pagan parents at Szombathely (now Hungary, but then in the Roman province of Pannonia) and served as a soldier. At the age of eighteen he was baptised and, around this time, met a naked beggar to whom he gave half his cloak. That night he had a dream in which the Lord Himself was wearing his cloak. St Martin founded a monastery and became Bishop of Tours (France). He was one of the first saints to be popularly venerated despite not being a martyr.



#### St Albert the Great, Bishop, Doctor of the Church - 15<sup>th</sup> November



St Albert the Great (1206-80) was born in the Swabian town of Lauingen (Germany) and studied at Padua and Paris. He became a Dominican and taught theology; his pupils included St Thomas Aquinas. In 1260 he was appointed bishop of Regensburg but resigned two years later and returned to academic pursuits. The encyclopaedic breadth of his writings earned him the title of 'Universal Doctor' and patron of students of the natural sciences.

#### St Margaret of Scotland - 16th November

Born in Hungary, where her father lived in exile, about the year 1046. She was given in marriage to Malcolm III, king of the Scots, and she bore him eight children. She was an outstanding example of a true mother and queen. She died at Edinburgh in the year 1093.
