


Richard was a much-loved and respected member of our congregation, and kept up his connection with St Teresa's and its parishioners after he and Anne moved from Westfield to Battle a few years ago. He had made an invaluable contribution to our church, in supervising

the work done to repair the building faults that had come to light and also in preparing information booklets as part of a "Welcome Pack" for new parishioners.

Richard was born in India during WW II. His parents brought him to England, along with his elder brother Christopher, in 1945, shortly before the end of the war. His parents then had another son, Anthony, and a daughter, Catherine. Richard was educated at Brompton Oratory School, Kensington, and St Joseph's, Beulah Hill. He studied physics at Surrey University, and then accountancy. He worked at Ferranti in Manchester, the accountancy firm Arthur Anderson, and then the Civil Engineers, Balfour Beatty. With them he was involved in projects in South Africa and Australasia. After early retirement in 2000, he and Anne devoted a lot of their time to charitable projects, including Pestalozzi Children's village, where he was a member of the Board. He was active in the Catenians, and through them in several other charitable projects. Richard and Anne met in Switzerland and were married in Arundel Cathedral in 1975. They have two sons, Michael and Anthony, and a daughter, Vicky. They have six grandchildren. In his retirement, Richard was a keen golfer (with Anne), and an accomplished artist and music-lover. Richard died suddenly of a massive stroke, out of the blue, on 12 February, 2020. He will be very much missed by his family and friends.
