- **Battle Pantry:** The pantry opened yesterday and is being advertised as a helping hand for those who live in TN33 postcode. It will be for members, but there is no requirement to use the pantry each week. Members just pay as they turn up to use it.

Clients can choose to pay £2.50 or £5.00, and for that they get four times the value in food and other essential items. They get to pick what they want, and everything is fresh and in date. Our pantry is not a waste minimisation initiative; it is there to help those struggling with the cost of living.

No. These are both initiatives of the same charity, and we can only support people using one avenue. The logic of the pantry is to help people before they get to the crisis stage and need a foodbank. Also, it may be that once a foodbank client has worked with our advisor, it is appropriate for them to then become a pantry client and stop using the foodbank, as their disposable income has improved/ is more stable. Our financial capability advice service is available to help clients of both the pantry and the foodbank.

CYMFed Flame Congress 2027 - Saturday 6 March 2027 at the OVO Arena

CYMFed's Flame Congress. Our Diocesan Youth Project Officer, Bex Driver, will be purchasing tickets for the Diocese from CYMFed this week and Parishes will then have the opportunity to purchase tickets from the Diocese for the event, this allows the schools and groups from Arundel and Brighton Diocese to sit together in a designated A&B section of the arena.

Flame Congress is the largest Catholic Youth event in England and Wales and is organised by the Catholic Youth Ministry Federation (CYMDFed), designed for young people aged 14 and over to share their faith with over 10,000 others! This bi-annual gathering aims to inspire and empower youth through faith, community and engaging activities, with input from world-renowned speakers, charities, Christian groups and youth ministry teams. The event is expected to attract over 10,000 participants across England and Wales and beyond, making it a significant occasion in the Catholic Youth calendar!
