# Events & Feasts of the Fortnight The Baptism of the Lord, 12<sup>th</sup> January



Almighty ever-living God, who, when Christ had been baptized in the River Jordan and as the Holy Spirit descended upon him, solemnly declared him your beloved Son, grant that your children by adoption, reborn of water and the Holy Spirit, may always be well pleasing to you. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever.

#### St Antony, Abbot, 17<sup>th</sup> January

Born in Egypt, about 260 AD. When his parents died, he gave his inheritance to the poor, and went into the desert, where he lived a life of penance. Many came to follow him, and he is known as the father of monks. He supported those who suffered for the faith under the persecutions of Diocletian, and helped St Athanasius in his fight against the Arians. He died in 356.



#### St Agnes, 21st January



St Agnes (+c.304) came from a noble Roman family. According to a 5<sup>th</sup> century legend, she was about 13 years old when she suffered martyrdom by being stabbed in the throat, after refusing to be married to a pagan. She was buried on the Via Nomentana and her name is included in the Roman Canon. She is often show with a lamb, a symbol of her purity and a play on her name (which in Greek means 'chaste') and the Latin word agnus, meaning lamb.

#### St Vincent, 22<sup>nd</sup> January

St Vincent was a deacon of the Church at Saragossa. He was brutally tortured and martyred at Valencia, in Spain, during the persecution of Diocletian, in about 304. His cult grew quickly and both St Augustine and St Leo preached sermons in his honour. He is the proto-martyr of Spain.



### Conversion of St Paul, 25th January

This Feast commemorates the conversion of Saul of Tarsus while he was on his way to Damascus to persecute Christians. He was blinded by alight and thrown from his horse to the ground, hearing the words, 'Saul, Saul, why do you persecute me?" As Pope Benedict XVI wrote, 'the Risen One spoke to Paul, called him to apostolate and made him a

true Apostle, a witness of the Resurrection, with the specific task of proclaiming the Gospel to the Gentiles, to the Graeco-Roman world. **God Bless** Fr Tony
